3. Reports

3.1 Police report.

PCSO Smith sent out the report. The Clerk had previously sent it out to the Parish Councillors.

Report from 03/12/21 – 07/01/22

4 Crimes reported -2 Violence – 1 incident involved a male and female assault on each other which is still under investigation, 1 violent incident had no lines of enquiry.

1 Crime (Theft) – Report of theft from a shop, there were no lines of enquiry.

1 Crime (Fraud) – Person reports a fraudulent call claiming to be from the police, this was passed to Action Fraud.

1 Road Traffic Collision Report – Report of a non- serious collision-the investigation is still ongoing.

3.2 County Councillor Les.

Covid numbers in North Yorkshire have risen sharply to 1500/100,000 cases but thankfully the severity of the disease is less than with the previous variants. The case numbers are expected to peak at the end of January. It is expected that the absentee level will have risen to 25% by this time and the County Council have been asking for volunteers from departments to help with vital services such as caring.

Without the pandemic there would be a need to increase the number of people employed in the Care sector. NYCC have launched the 'Make Care Matter' campaign to try and increase the numbers entering this profession.

NYCC have £30million to use over 10 years to install electric charging points throughout the County. Catterick Village is to be used as a Pilot village.

Northern Power Grid are installing the electric for the new retail park at Scotch Corner. This will mean closing the Richmond to Skeeby Rd for 3 months starting at the end of February– The diversion will be along the service road from Scotch Corner to J52 and then along the A6136 to Richmond. The Council are still having meetings with National PowerGrid to try and alter how the work is carried out to try and alleviate the problem.

3.3 Cllr Threlfall

RDC is making available Covid Support for businesses and the Additional Restrictions Grant scheme is again available to support Community Associations such as halls and sports and Social Clubs.

The Community Infra Structure Fund will be running for another year.

3.4 District Councillor Rowe

Cllr Rowe emailed his report to the Clerk and this was read out by Cllr Campbell.

There was a full District Council meeting on the 7th December 2021. Amongst other things the Council decided to lobby central government about inadequate emergency funding after storm Arwen and inadequate funding of public transport after the publication of the government's integrated rail plan.

It was also noted that the political balance of committees had been adjusted after the defection of a conservative member to the ruling "Richmondshire Together" group.

The District Council has its first Corporate Board meeting of 2022 tomorrow (Tuesday) when the finances for the new financial year will be discussed. However, the Council's council tax precept will not be set until February. Proposals include additional funds for improving Richmond swimming pool and affordable housing in Bainbridge. There's also a proposal for funds to help local businesses to take on new apprentices.

3.4 Marne Barracks.

Major Graham emailed his report to the Clerk and this was read out by Cllr Campbell
5 RA have Officers and Soldiers deployed helping with the NHS.

32 RE have 150 pax deployed with NATO to Poland.

The remainder personnel from both Regiments have returned from XMAS leave, however most are working from home where possible.
