1. Apologises for absence.

2. Open Forum

2 members of the public attended.

One resident attended to discuss the damage caused to the grass on High Green by the presence of Chafer grubs. He explained that a flying beetle lays eggs in the soil in spring which hatch into the Chafer grubs which feed on the roots of the grass. Crows and other birds tear up the grass sods to get to the grubs, causing damage to the grass. He explained that at the moment the grass does not look too bad as the grubs have developed into the beetles and flown away but the area looks green due to weeds rather than grass. He is worried that the area involved will get larger as it has over the last couple of years.

He said there is no pesticides against the grubs but a natural treatment using nematodes is available. The cost would be around £60. He said he would be prepared to administrator the treatment if the Parish Council paid for the product. It would need to be carried out in September/October.

The treatment is meant to be safe for humans and animals.

The Clerk asked Cllr Les if the use of nematodes is permitted in a public place. He will check this.

The Councillors agreed in principle to the treatment but will let the resident know what the advice is from the council before confirming it.

The Clerk has had an email from a resident about horses being ridden along the footpath between Slessor Rd and Mill Bungalows and the mess the horses make. She asked Sgt Lancaster if the police were the correct people to contact as horses should not be ridden on a footpath. She suggested the Environment Agency. Cllr Les said he would get some clarification on this.

3.2 North Yorkshire Council

Cllr Les – He reported about the fire on Langdale Moor. It covers 22 sq km. At one point it was thought that it had been contained but the wind changed direction. 2 roads have been shut and the Coast-to-Coast path. Unexploded shells from training during World War 11 have been causing additional hazards. 19 have so far exploded.

Luckily there have been no injuries and no evacuations needed.

3.4 Marne Barracks

Major Dent could not attend the meeting but sent this report.

- Both Regiments now returned from summer block leave.
- No set date for heavy plant machinery to start moving on site but a meeting is set for 10 Sep to discuss new electrical sub stations to be installed which will involve some heavy plant.

6. Current Issues

6.1 Adoption of the Risk Management Assessment Policy and renewal and readoption of the risk assessments.

As mentioned by the clerk at the June meeting, she has been working on producing a risk management assessment policy and register and updating risk assessments. 6.2 Wall/Trees in the cemetery.

The clerk has still not received the full survey report on the cemetery wall. She will contact them again.

The two trees have been felled but unfortunately during the felling damage was done to the surrounding area – the surface grass around the graves has been churned up and there have been some complaints from residents. One resident thinks that the grave stone of his family plot has been damaged. The Clerk met with Rennisons to discuss the damage and they have now levelled off the area, added top soil and reseeded it. They have also removed a pile of sawdust that had been left from grinding the stumps. The tree surgeon that did the felling said that he has removed quite a few vases and artifacts from the area that had been blown around in the gales before he started work and he thought he had removed a dove that had been knocked off the grave stone. There were no chips or other damage to this gravestone or any others.

Cllr Campbell has been to check the area since the repairs and she thinks that they have probably done as much as they can. Cllr Oselton is still not happy with the area. It was decided to wait and see if the grass starts to grow before the bill is paid.

6.3 Tree Survey

The tree survey was carried out on July 18th. No report has yet been received. The Clerk has contacted them and will do so again.
